Notes: as of 7/28/23, SlaveVoyages contains 2 listings for Tybee and none for Cockspur. While some vessels stopped at Tybee and Cockspur to quarantine, generally to prevent the spread of smallpox, it's unclear why others stopped at these locations. Some may have stopped for health inspections. However, scholars have noted that large oceangoing vessels had difficulty navigating the shallow waters of the Savannah River and so boats may have been used to transport cargoes (see McMillin, p. 13).
